RULES OF THE HOUSE

HOW TO GET IN

The house has keyless doorknobs upstairs and down. The combination is **4-6-6-3**. Press the "Lock" button to lock it on your way out. Turn the lock vertical to lock from the inside.

PARKING

There is room for 5 cars in the driveway. Please park extra vehicles out at the entrance to Benson Point Road. DO NOT DRIVE onto the yard or park in neighbors' driveways or yards. DO NOT go in the garage.

SMOKING AND DRUGS

Smoking is PROHIBITED inside the house, subject to a \$500 fine. Anyone smoking outside must use an ashtray. Please dispose of cigarette butts. Use of marijuana and narcotics is also prohibited.

PARTIES

No parties or large gatherings are permitted. The maximum number of occupants in the house is 12.

AMENITIES & INSTRUCTIONS

LINENS

- Each bed is made up with sheets, pillows, a blanket, and a comforter. Linens for the sofa beds are in the captain's chests in the living rooms. Extra pillows and blankets are in bedroom closets.
- Bath towels are supplied; beach towels for the lake and hot tub are not.
- You are responsible for washing any linens or towels in excess of one set of sheets per bed and one set of washcloths and towels per person.

TELEPHONE

The chalet's phone number is (802) 228-7343. Local calls are free.

TVs

Enjoy large-screen TVs up and down, and in several bedrooms. The family room TVs have cable. Bring your streaming passwords or enjoy Xfinity cable.

KITCHEN

The kitchens are stocked with pots and pans, toasters, dishes, glasses, utensils, toasters, coffee makers, microwaves, blenders, and spices.

GAS FIREPLACE

To light the gas fireplace upstairs: Press the screen on the remote (found on the wall to the left above the fireplace, labeled FIREPLACE) to activate it, then press TURN FLAME ON for a full second. There is a short delay and the glass will be hazy at first. When done, press TURN FLAME OFF.

LAUNDRY ROOM

The washer and drier are in the laundry room to the left of the upstairs fireplace. There is detergent on the shelf, as well as appliance instructions.

TRASH & RECYCLABLES

- Trash goes in the wooden bins on the front patio, in tied-shut kitchen trash bags, *never* loose. Secure lids to keep out bears and raccoons!
- There's a recycling bin in each kitchen. Put plastic, glass, paper, and cardboard in bags, tied shut, in theblue bins on the front patio.



AMENITIES & INSTRUCTIONS

During the warmer months, we offer the following amenities:

- Two huge decks and a patio.
- An Amish-made porch swing.
- A hammock.
- A fire pit. (Notify Ludlow police if you plan to use it 802-228-4411) Please make sure your fire is completely extinguished. Notify Summit if the stack of firewood gets low so it can be replenished.
- An extra-large picnic table by the woods.
- A horseshoe pit area.
- A volleyball net that rolls open.
- A shed full of outdoor games cornhole, badminton, horseshoes, and more. Please return them to the shed when you're done using them.

BBQ GRILL

There is gas grill on the front deck. Grill utensils are in the upstairs kitchen, and a cleaning brush hangs from the grill. We maintain two full gas tanks and replenish them regularly. If yours runs out, visit Aubuchon Hardware on Route 103 in Ludlow to refill the tank, and send a copy of your receipt for reimbursement.

HOT TUB CARE

How to Use the Hot Tub Cover-VIDEO Hot Tub Maintenance-VIDEO

After Each Use

- Turn on the jets and put in 1 1/3 tablespoons of Enhanced Shock (Orange Cap).
- If the water gets cloudy, turn the jets on and put in 1 1/3 tablespoons of Chlorine (Blue Cap).
- If water is still cloudy after one hour, use a test strip to check the pH balance, and apply chemicals as instructed.

When You Leave

• Put in 1 1/3 tablespoons of chlorine to keep the water clean for the next group. DO NOT turn down the heat.

For Your Safety

- Use the hot tub at your own risk. Do not use the hot tub if you have an open wound, or if could be pregnant.
- Limit use by children under 12. If younger children are using it, turn the temperature to 100.
- At the top temperature, 104 degrees, you should not spend more than 15 minutes in the tub.
- Keep the tub closed when not in use.

NOTE: The Bengal hot tub fits up to 6 people. Hot tub chemicals are in the closet of the upstairs left bedroom. There's a towel holder attached to the house under the roof to keep towels dry. To its right is a gray circuit box. Occasionally the circuits get overwhelmed trying to keep the water hot and trip the breaker. If this happens, the POWER light will flash on the display in the tub, and the water will start to cool. Just open the circuit box door and flip the breaker off and on. DO NOT let the hot tub freeze! Make sure you haven't accidentally turned on "Summer Mode," which will turn the tub off.

THE DOCK & BOATS

HOW TO GET TO THE DOCK

It's a two-minute walk to our private dock on Lake Rescue. Just walk to the far end of the yard past the sign that says Lake House Dock. Continue to the road, pass one house on the right. To the left, you'll see a patch of trees and a "Lake House Dock" sign, just past a driveway and a dark green house with a small matching woodshed and garden. Pass the sign, then walk down the steps (to the right) to our dock, with a canoe and four kayaks. A storage bin holds oars, paddles, and life jackets in sizes from baby to XL. Please store all items as you found them when finished. (We suggest you brush out any spiders before using boats.)

USE THE BOATS AT YOUR OWN RISK!

Everyone using the boats MUST have a life jacket; it's state law. People over 12 must have them on the boat, and those under 12 must **wear** them or you'll be subject to a fine! New at this? Watch this video: <u>How to get in the kayak</u>.

STORING THE BOATS

Please store the boats upside-down on top of the right-hand dock. Disassemble paddles and oars and return them to the bin, and close it firmly.

Take your trash with you! Please notify Summit Solutions if any boats or accessories are missing.


GOLF



CHECK-OUT INFO

Check-out is 11 AM Sharp

KITCHENS:

- Wash all dishes, pots, and pans, or run in dishwasher. Please do not leave any dirty dishes behind.
- Throw out or take any perishable food.
- Return kitchen items to their proper places.
- Turn off appliances.
- **Garbage:** Put all garbage in the big cans inside the wooden bins on the front patio, with trash bags tied shut.
- **Recycling:** Put all recycling paper, plastic, glass, and cardboard inside the blue recycling bins on the front patio, closed securely.

BEDROOMS: Strip the beds. Leave dirty sheets & towels in the laundry room.

GAMES: Put games away neatly in their boxes and return them to the upstairs hall closet.

DECKS: Clean and cover the grill and discard trash.

HOT TUB: Put 1 1/3 tablespoons of chlorine (blue bottle) in the hot tub and turn the jets on for 1 minute, then close the cover. Do not turn the temperature down.

GAS FIREPLACE: Make sure it is turned off.

FURNITURE: Return any furniture you moved to its original position.

LIGHTS: Turn off all lights and appliances.

LOCK UP! Lock all outside doors.

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY DIAL 911

THERE IS A FIRE EXTINGUISHER IN EACH KITCHEN AND AN EMERGENCY KIT IN THE HUTCH IN THE UPSTAIRS DINING ROOM.

There are smoke/CO2 alarms on both levels of the house, as well as a sprinkler system. If you set off the smoke alarm, please evacuate! If it's a minor or kitchen problem, turn it off at the red box to the right of the downstairs front door. Type 54321 two times. Then answer the phone when the fire department calls.
